

DEADLINE SUBMISSION DATE: March 10, 2019

General Information:

The T.S.C.A.R. Scholarship is for members who are graduating seniors and or full-time college students who have not reached the age of twenty-two during the year of application (defined as 1 January to 31 December). The scholarship is available to members without regard to enrollment in public, private, or homeschool program. The T.S.C.A.R. member must be in good standing with the National Society of the Children of the American Revolution and have been involved with a Tennessee Society for a minimum of three (3) years. The scholarship award is only awarded once to a qualified applicant. College plans do not have to be completed in order to receive the award. This scholarship is set at a maximum of \$1,200.00 per year.

Requirements:

The applicants that qualify for the scholarship must meet the guidelines and submit all required documentation. The application packet must be received no later than March 10, 2019 to be in consideration for the scholarship. The documents are sent to the T.S.C.A.R. Scholarship Chairman at:

- 1. Completed Scholarship Application Form (Parts One and Two). Download from the T.S.C.A.R. website the guidelines/form and or see attachment.
- 2. Double space typed essay 400-500 words on the topic (Part Three): "How my C.A.R. involvement has prepared me for the future"
- 3. Three letters of recommendation from a Senior Society President, teacher, principal, counselor, scout leader, coach, or pastor.
- 4. School transcripts.

Recap: Submit completed T.S.C.A.R. Scholarship Application Form (Parts One and Two), 400-500-word essay (Part Three), three (3) letters of recommendation, and school transcripts. Submit all documents to Chairman by mail or in a PDF format electronically to Reneesrobinson94@gmail.com by March 10, 2019 deadline.

T.S.C.A.R. Scholarship Committee:

The Scholarship Committee is composed of an aged-out Honorary State President, an Honorary Senior State President, and a current Senior State officer. The Scholarship Committee is appointed by the Senior State President. Any family member of an applicant must recuse himself/herself from the committee. The scholarship does not have to be awarded. Scoring will be merit-based. Decision of the committee is final. All proceedings of the committee are confidential. The recipient will be announced at the Annual State Conference Banquet. Scholarship checks will be mailed to the college or university, and the recipient is responsible for submitting the name and address of the university official to the scholarship chairman.
